Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children will continue to understand gradually how others might be feeling and how to find solutions to conflicts and rivalries within their play. They will learn how to respect and care for the world around them. As well as learning about growth in nature, children will be encouraged to think about how they have changed and grown.

Mathematical Development

Children will learn how to sequence, such as putting familiar nursery rhymes in the correct order and sequencing their daily routine. They will also learn and use positional language. Children will be introduced to the concept of 'more than' and 'fewer'.

Children will then learn about different shapes and will be encouraged to notice and describe shapes in the environment and talk about the properties using words such as 'straight, flat, round and curved'.

Children will continue to experience a wide range of songs, poems and rhymes. They will continue to develop their phonological awareness, so that they can spot and suggest rhymes, count or clap syllables in a word and recognise words with the same initial sound. They will be encouraged to mark make in a range of different ways and to use some of their print and letter knowledge in their early writing.

Physical Development

This half term the children will learn to use large-muscle movements to develop their gross motor skills and use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils. They will be encouraged to be increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed, for example, putting coats on and doing up zips. Within their play, children will have opportunities to develop their fine motor skills and we will continue to do 'dough disco' and 'squiggle whilst you wiggle' every day.

Communication and Language

Children will continue to be provided with a rich language environment as we regularly share books and encourage extended conversations about those books. We will focus on key stories, which link to our topic and will introduce the children to new vocabulary.
