History & Geography

We will examine how the Industrial Revolution changed Britain and our geography work will focus on the British Empire. We will attend Beamish Museum to enhance our learning of this topic.

Science

We will understand how fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago. We will research the work of **Charles Darwin** and *The Origin of Species* which was published in the Victorian times.

Computing

During this half term we will continue to complete our coding unit. Once finished, we will move onto our **blogging** unit. Here, the children will learn the basic principles of creating and maintaining a blog in a controlled and safe environment.

Maths

This half term in maths we will be focusing on **fractions**.
