

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children will continue to understand gradually how others might be feeling and how to find solutions to conflicts and rivalries within their play. They will learn how to respect and care for the world around them. As well as learning about growth in nature, children will be encouraged to think about how they have changed and grown.

Physical Development

This half term the children will learn to run skilfully and negotiate space successfully, as well as continue to develop their balance and coordination. Children will be encouraged to be increasingly independent as they get dressed and undressed, for example, putting coats on and doing up zips. Within their play, children will have opportunities to develop their fine motor skills and we will continue to do 'dough disco' and 'squiggle whilst you wiggle' every day.

Communication and Language

Children will continue to be provided with a rich language environment as we regularly share books and encourage extended conversations about those books. We will focus on key stories, which link to our topic and will introduce the children to new vocabulary.

Mathematical Development

Children will be focusing on the composition of numbers 5 and 6, developing their ability to subitise and learning how to represent numbers in different ways. They will then explore the concept of capacity. Children will then be introduced to the concept of more and fewer. The children will use real objects to see that the quantity of a group can be changed by adding more.

Understanding of the World

During this topic, children will begin to understand the need to respect and care for their environment and all living things. They will take part in scientific exploration of animal and plant life cycles, and they will plant seeds and learn to care for growing plants. They will learn about what a plant needs in order to grow.

Literacy

Children will continue to experience a wide range of songs, poems and rhymes. They will continue to develop their phonological awareness, so that they can spot and suggest rhymes, count or clap syllables in a word and recognise words with the same initial sound. They will be encouraged to mark make in a range of different ways and to use some of their print and letter knowledge in their early writing.
